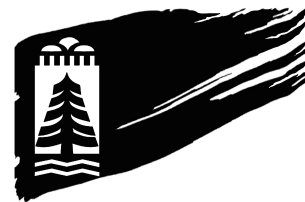

Week 1 (June 4th- 8th)

- AM Everything Duct Tape** *Eben Bold* Students will learn the fundamentals of making duct tape art and crafts, such as wallets, flowers, bows, and more.
- AM Eco-Art** *Livy Snyder* Create environmentally conscious works of art. Students will become resourceful in their use of materials as they learn about the environment and interpret it. Art projects will include temporary installations.
- PM Pop Art** *Livy Snyder* Study the evolution of Pop art throughout the Modern Art Movement. Students will bring in a can of their own that they will depict in different mediums, collage a photograph of their choosing, and explore advertisements as art while creating brand names.
- PM Sketching around Town** *Karen Trythall* We will work with the differences between drawing and sketching and then tour the town with art supplies and our sketchbooks, stopping at several locations to work outside. **You will need a hat, sunblock, good walking shoes, a water bottle and your own sketchbook.**

Week 2 (June 11th- 15th)

- AM Yarn Crafts** *Britton Donharl* Just what can you do with yarn? So many things! Create a t-shirt yarn basket, yarn critters, and even paint with it to create fun art!
- AM The Broformers' Junior Circus** *Eben Bold and Max Herrmann* The Broformers are here to teach the next generation of young circus performers. This is a wonderful class if you want to learn juggling, balance, and other mesmerizing acts! Boys and girls step right up and learn how to be an honorary junior juggler!
- PM Be Your Own Hero** *Jacob Spill* Don't wait around for Superman to save the day – you're going to make your own comic! This is for the hero in all of us! We'll get into comic illustration as well as a variety of superhero-themed projects.
- PM Anime Afternoons** *Karen Trythall* Students will learn fundamentals for drawing anime faces, bodies and animals. Emphasis will be on pencil but colored pencil and pens will also be available. At the end of the week, students will have several portfolio pieces that could be hung on their walls.

Week 3 (June 18th- 22nd)

- AM FrankenToys** *Liz Martineau* In celebration of the 200th anniversary of Mary Shelley's book Frankenstein, we will practice taking apart and recombining words (portmanteau), pictures, and toys. Warning: This could get creepy!
- AM Color Mix Crazy** *Britton Donharl* Colorful pigments can be so fascinating! Experiment with paint through dripping, squishing, printing, mixing and swirling. This class might get messy!
- PM Snippets of Modern Art** *Livy Snyder* Students will create an artwork a day inspired by the different movements in Modern Art; including, Dada, Constructivism, and Abstract Expressionism.
- PM Fabric and Yarn Creations** *Ellen Mancini* Sew pouches and pillows using colorful fabric with decorative additions. Challenge yourself with weaving. Get silly and make a sock monster. Create dream catchers and God's Eyes.

Week 4 (June 25th- 29th)

- AM Visual Poetry** *Livy Snyder* Visual Poetry is the media between writing and visual arts. Students will explore the history of visual poetry, from cave caricatures to concrete poetry and create their own artwork combining literature and visual elements.
- AM Movie Making Magic** *Jacob Spill* Wouldn't you love to star in a movie created by you and your classmates? Prepare yourself for a week of lights, camera, and action! We'll design sets, create props, and act our way through the week completing a short film for you, your family, and friends to enjoy! **This class requires parents to sign the media release form.**
- PM Star Wars Creations** *Jacob Spill* Get ready for a week of fun projects including light sabers and other crafts from a galaxy far, far away. Perfect for all Jedi and Sith in training!
- PM Paper Decoration and Origami** *Karen Trythall* We will make nontoxic marbled, stamped, and dyed papers, and random abstract papers to use for Origami. At the end of the week you will take home a portfolio of usable papers, practical origami, origami animals, and ornamental origami.

Week 5 (July 2nd – 6th NO CLASS WEDNESDAY)

- AM The Street** *Livy Snyder* Claes Oldenburg is one artist who found inspiration in objects, people, and situations that made up the humor of life. Like Oldenburg, students will use everyday objects as building blocks for drawing and painting compositions. The students will also be involved with sculptural activities, such as a collaborative project of building a soft sculpture in the form of a giant hamburger.
- PM DIY Magic the Gathering Deck** *David Daniel* Come join in the fun world of card dueling with Magic: The gathering. This class will focus on basics of the game, practice matches, the true stories of the myths and art behind the MTG metaverse, and on helping young players design their very own homebrew cards and decks!

Week 6 (July 9th - 13th)

- AM Art from the Heart** *Trey Pereyra* Use art to dig a little deeper and display our emotions! Do a variety of projects to explore your emotions, talk about art therapy and show yourself in your work.
- AM Short Story Workshop** *David Daniel* Each participant will create and revise an original work, participate in the critique and revision process of their own and others' work, and have the opportunity to have their creations professionally self-published in a workshop anthology at the end of the class.
- PM Alternative Photographic Practices** *Livy Snyder* Currently, to take a photo is as simple as pressing a button. However, there are many ways to make photographs. In this class, students will learn historical photographic techniques for creating cyanotypes, anthotypes, and many others! We will even create a camera obscura!
- PM Doodle Anything and Everything** *Karen Trythall* Learn to draw animals, people, machines, buildings, and habitats on a variety of surfaces! At the end of the week you will have a folder of how-to handouts, several all over doodle pages and some miscellaneous doodled items. **Bring your own**

Week 7 (July 16th - 20th)

- AM Around the World** *Trey Pereyra* Create a passport and board a train to go around the world... through art! We will discover the different forms of art and how each culture represents their world to others.
- AM Let's go to France** *Stephanie Rittner* From cave paintings to impressionism... Let's travel through time in France! We will draw, paint, and sculpt as we are inspired by the many amazing French Artists
- PM Everything Printmaking** *Mary Grace* Unleash your imagination as we explore everything printmaking!
- PM Discover Disney** *Trey Pereyra* Discover the magic of Disney! Start at the beginning with our favorite mouse as we walk through history and art to present day Disney. Learn about making our favorite Disney characters and maybe just create a few of our own!

Week 8 (July 23rd - 27th)

- AM Arts of Africa** *Trey Pereyra* Immerse yourself in the culture of Africa! Discover various forms of color and art as we move through the wild lands of Africa, listening to the beating of drums as you dance and tell stories by firelight!
- AM Roll for Initiative** *David Daniel* Based around a simple campaign of the role-playing game "Dungeons and Dragons", participants will explore the building blocks and techniques of creating unforgettable characters. Examine famous examples of unforgettable characters, and play together with fellow students to overcome challenges set forth by a veteran Dungeon Master.
- PM Kids Paint Party** *Susanne Harrison* Paint all week. We will be painting with watercolor paints, tempera paint, acrylic paints and pastels on surfaces of all shapes and sizes.
- PM Make Your Own Books** *Ellen Mancini* Fabricate unique book covers using different kinds of paper or fabric. Fill the pages with topics of interest using artwork, collage, drawing or words that you have created.

Week 9 (July 30th – August 3rd)

- AM Acting Out!** *Jazmine Torres* This class offers a variety of theatre games and improv techniques. We will explore basic stage movement and theatrical story telling. Students will have the opportunity to create and perform a lip sync at the end of the week.
- AM Wearable Fiber Art** *Katie Brousseau* Create unique fashions using a variety of fibers and fiber art techniques, including needle and wet felting and dyeing.
- PM Dia de los Muertos – Sugar Skulls** *Susanne Harrison* Create a sugar skull mask, a papier-mache skull, skull painting, skull garland and more.
- PM Architectural Adventures** *Liz Martineau* Explore our local place, from the Romero Cabin to Mesa Public Library. Each day we will walk to a nearby building to connect with the local architecture. We will use what we learn about materials, form, and function to design our own spaces.
